The Benefits of Using a Manometer:



When making a Mauget Micro-Infusion/Injection application it is important to know if the tree is under negative or positive pressure. In a tree under positive pressure it is likely that the capsules won't drain into the tree because

it's internal system is static. However a tree with a properly translocating/transpiring system is under negative pressure which means that it is a tree primed for an application. Using a digital manometer makes it simple and easy to determine the tree's internal pressure.

In recent field studies, a manometer was used on a Sycamore tree in Pasadena, California, With a manometer reading of negative 2.8 pressure, 7.5 mil capsules of ArborFos were injected into the tree and compressed using a compression tool. The capsules drained in less than five minutes,

showing a substantially faster uptake. From these trials it became clear that a tree has to be under negative pressure in order for the material to drain properly. Using the manometer prior to injecting made it easy and simple to know the state of the interior of the tree.

17th ANNUAL USDA INTERAGENCY FORUM POSTER PRESENTATION—ANNAPOLIS MARYLAND

Mauget is proud to have recently had a published poster on display at the prestigious 17th Annual USDA Interagency Forum, in Annapolis Maryland, on the Control of Asian Cycad Scale on Cycas revolute & C. taitungensis, using Imicide trunk injection by Terry Tattar and Arnold Farran.

The Asian Cycad Scale (Aulacaspsis yasumatsui), has become a major forest pest wherever Cycads grow including native forests in Guam, Puerto Rico and other locations around the world and has the potential of destroying native Cycad forests forever. This insect has caused serious losses in nursery cycad stock and in cycad landscape plantings in California, Florida, and Puerto Rico. Control of this insect by spray application has not been effective. Research has demonstrated that application of Imicide 3ml, via trunk injection is an effective control.

Q. Why use a Hi Helix drill bit?

A. When drilling into a tree you must always take care not to wound the tree more than you need to. This is why Mauget recommends using a HI Helix drill bit. The Hi Helix drill bit is designed to cut a flute of wood which is more like a surgical cut into the tree. The edges are very sharp which makes for a clean "incision". It is also essential that drill bits be disinfected before each use to prevent the spread of any diseases between trees.

<u> The Living Fossil ...</u>

In September of 1994, in a canyon of the Wollemi National Park in Australia, a dramatic discovery was made. The Wollemi Pine (named for the park in which it was discovered) was found thriving. The Wollemi Pine is of an evolutionary line thought to be long extinct—its closest relative being trees that became extinct between 200 and 65 million years ago.

Only forty trees are known to exist, which makes the Wollemi the rarest tree on the planet. The tree is distinctive in nature and appearance. The leaves are light green and the leaf structure is extremely complex with both male

and female cones, making it bisexual. The trunk has a highly unusual brown , knobby cork-like bark which has led to it being budded 'the Coco Pops tree'.

Because of the extreme danger to the plant from illegal seed collecting, the actual Australian location is being kept secret, but it does exist as a "living fossil".

Unlike some other investments that depreciate, a tree's value increases with every passing year. Trees increase home property values 7 to 21 percent, depending on the number and size of the trees.
